Fringe Festival

Dear council . We live opposite Haslemere station. The noise from the fringe festival now at lion green has been going from 9.00 am till past 11. Pm . My husband works from home and this pop rock beat 24 hours a day is just not fair on people going to bed earlier . Children and students and well everybody should not have to deal with constant noise .'in futurel feel you should put the fringe out of town if there is constant loud music . It is so unfair on normal people who work from home . It keeps us awake when we go to bed . I work 6 days and 2 evenings and when I come home now is just constant banging of the drums. Who allowed this to happen ?

We live by a busy road, opposite a pub. Every day we hear car horns, car music, motorbikes revving, burglar and car alarms emergency vehicle sirens. We have parties here - some with music.

We all live with outside noise in our lives BUT on the nights of Friday, Saturday and Sunday 1st - 4th July we were subjected to the almost constant beat of a bade drum. This noise came into the building and reverberated around all of the flats. Even the ones at the side and opposite Tesco did not escape it.

Imagine - if you can - a very large bade drum being struck, in your living room for several minutes at a time throughout the course of 3 evenings. It is not "pleasant". Windows and doors vibrated, ornaments "danced", pictures on the walls moved. Closing the windows did not help as the bade effect was too strong.

2 of our neighbours had to be rescued by their families. Another spent the afternoon on a T1 bus to escape the noise.

Over the years there have been festivals, parties, circuses and funfairs on the green, all causing noise. The noise levels were acceptable, but this year they were horrendous. The constant BOOM

BOOM, BOOM over 3 nights and 2 days
totally unacceptable.

An organiser of The Fringe said that the
noise levels were checked and were acceptable—
to whom? Maybe he should have stood in the
main entrance and heard the front door
rattling!

We are not a bunch of petty killjoys but
people whose privacy, and sanity, was invaded
by the BOOM BOOM BOOM of a base drum.

with "Wasn't it peaceful last night".
