INTRODUCTION

Haslemere Town Council receives 25% of money received through the Community Infrastructure Levy, collected by Waverley Borough Council (WBC) from development in Haslemere. Any CIL monies due are confirmed by WBC at the end of 6 monthly periods ending in March and September and paid to Haslemere Town Council shortly thereafter. The funds are available to spend on local projects in Haslemere. As set out in the CIL Regulations, this local proportion of CIL should be used for:

- · The provision, improvement, replacement, operation or maintenance of infrastructure; or
- Anything else that is concerned with addressing the demands that development places on an area

The definition of infrastructure is broad and includes amongst other items:

- Roads and other transport infrastructure
- Schools and other educational facilities
- Medical facilities
- Open spaces
- Sporting and recreational facilities
- Flood defences

Please read the Haslemere Town Council CIL funding application form guidance notes before completing this form. To discuss a potential project, or for further guidance, please contact the NAME.

Please note that if an external organisation has been granted CIL funds for a project it may not apply for further CIL funding, regardless of the project, until twelve months have elapsed since the previous award was granted.

CIL applications will be validated by AND consideration by the CIL Committee, applications accepted by the CIL Committee will be forwarded to the Full Council for further consideration and prioritising against available and anticipated funds.

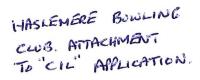

TREASURERS REPORT



Two documents are provided in support of this report

- Income and Expenditure Statement 31 Oct 2021 to £1 Oct 2022
- HBC Budget Forecast for 2022-2023

The trading Balance for the year just concluded records a loss of £2830.97 which is disappointing, but understandable, if you examine the level of fixed costs associated with preparing and maintaining a six rink green and essential supporting necessities, compared with the membership levels. Whilst Judy and her team achieved a significant result with the membership drive we still need to go further next season and continue to increase active membership to a level which makes the club financially viable.

Factors contributing to the trading deficit were

- Low number of active members at the start of the season creating an inability to
 meet all Friendly Fixture commitments with 18 being cancelled with the loss of £500
 revenue. This picked up later in the season as new members participated. This is not
 a problem common to Haslemere and many other of our local clubs are struggling
 and some like Bramley have ceased to continue into next year
- Increase (£500) in the green contractor's annual fee which he had held static for three years. Current charges will remain in force until April next year when we will have to negotiate a new contract price.
- High Repair and maintenance costs associated with replacing both water heaters, one of which previously failed and caused the flooding of the clubhouse.
- Lingering affects of Covid and the impact on socialising
- Poor return from the bar which was slow to start but picked up later in the season members drinking habits have also changed with a greater demand for non alcoholic beverages
- As always there is the 'dead period' between 31 Oct and 24 Apr when very little revenue is raised but we still pay out at least £625/month to the green contractor

On the positive side the club lottery has been a major success and a key part of our revenue raising and we hope to improve on that. A vote of thanks to Brian Archbold for all his efforts.

The net financial position of the club stands at £18169.06 and the next two years are critical in turning around the club's position. The committee is following all possible avenues to ensure that we reach a sustainable financial future. The key is increasing membership with active participation in all club activities and being prepared to pay what is necessary for the club facility.

With regard to the Budget Forecast for next year I will not write in detail here but speak from the floor at the meeting. There are significant challenges that could increase costs and therefore make us work harder to at best balance the books
