CLERK'S REPORT TO COUNCIL – JULY 2022

Support for Ukraine. The Town Clerk continues to attend weekly meetings with WBC and SCC and is acting as a point of contact for the local Haslemere for Ukraine group. On Friday 8th July she accompanied 17 Ukranians to a job fair hosted at the Memorial Hall in Farnham. It is hoped that a similar event can be held soon in Haslemere with local employers in attendance.

Cash provision in Haslemere – the Clerk has been approached by Link offering to conduct a review of the provision of cash in Haslemere. After consultation with Hindhead councillors she will ask that the review is extended to cover Beacon Hill.

Walking Festival – the Clerk and Cllr Dullaway haven been working with Visit Haslemere and Cllr Odell (with her Museum hat on) to finalise details of the Haslemere Walking Festival which takes place over the weekend of 15th to 17th July. Thank you to the councillors and staff who have offered to volunteer on walks.

External Audit and accountant – the Clerk has submitted all documentation required by PKF Littlejohn, a period of public scrutiny is now in progress. With the retirement of the Council's longstanding accountant, Alan Harland, a replacement – Paul Burdick of ACCLC - Accounting for Local Councils & Clerks has been sourced.


