DRAFT/CIL committee strategy paper for the spending of CIL funds

The Infrastructure and CIL Committee wishes to ensure that, where possible, it commits to the spending priorities reflected in the newly adopted Haslemere Town Council strategy document 2023-2027, together with the Opportunities set out in the Haslemere Neighbourhood Plan.

The Council strategy and Neighbourhood Plan will provide a framework for future CIL expenditure and grant giving, where it can support a wide range of community initiatives promoting sustainability and the enhancement of residents' lives.

The Committee is maintaining a list of projects that it wishes to pursue, subject to scrutiny to ensure the project demonstrates it meets the Government criteria for CIL spending (page 2 of this document).

In addition, it was agreed that 25% of CIL receipts would be used to create a pot that external organisations could apply to for projects. Two meetings a year will be held - June & November - following receipt of April and October Neighbourhood CIL funds from WBC.

Funding pot for external organisations

A pot equivalent to 25% of biannual CIL receipts for external community groups and organisations to apply to. Payments are made to the Council twice yearly (April & October). It is proposed that CIL committee meetings held following those payments (eg June and November) consider applications from any group who has validly applied for CIL funding.

EXAMPLE

April 2023 CIL receipts £136,000 25% equates to £34,000

October 2023 CIL receipts £124,000 25% equates to £31,000
