Issue Description (incl. location)

Fence along main road going from high street to train station. The wire fencing is coming apart

In front of the train station, the signpost is broken at the top and looks ugly

This sign is always on or always off, and never accurate. As a result, people ignore it and when there really IS a vehicle in the middle of the road they don't know to move over. I've reported this to Surrey multiple times, and spoken to John Robini about it, who said they don't have budget to actually fix this sign. I think this is a hazard that's going to get someone killed.

Tasteful, but still graffiti, on the bridge going over the train line on church In

Pathways foot path from Church In to Town Center, this iron fence lines the side of the walk. This fence features rusted and very sharp spikes, many of which are bent inward towards passersby. In some places, the spikes have been sawed off. I think all of these should be sawed off to maintain the original character but remove the risk of someone impaling themselves and getting On Pathways foot path between Church Ln and Town center, right in front of the abandoned community center, is this waste bin. It is overflowing about half the time I walk by it, and due to the lack of top the trash is visible and smelly. We should replace this bin with a larger one, with a top, and include a dog waste only bin near it as well

Many people cross here from the Museum side as the pathway ends and the closest crossing is far away. Pedestrians have little visibility to southward moving cars and similarly those cars have little visibility to pedestrians. This is an accident waiting to happen. Including a crossing here would improve safety for pedestrians and also help mitigate speeding through town

Haslemere car park in front of the bathrooms. The bollard has been hit and is coming out of the ground, raising the pavement This speed warning sign in front of the Wells on Lower Street has been broken for years, and is dilapidated. I have raised this with Surrey CC many times. John Robini says the council has no budget to repair it and doesn't plan on fixing it. At the very least it should be removed, but due to speeding problems on this street I'd recommend we actually get it fixed.
