New bins.


SANG update

Our grounds contractor has undertaken the first maintenance cut of the pathways under the terms of the management plan.

We've also had a request to install more benches, but under Natural England's SANG quality guidance document artificial infrastructure should be kept to a minimum and be discreet. It has been suggested that a review of benches should take place once the rectification period has expired (19 April 2025).

War memorial repair

The wall surrounding the war memorial has now been repaired.



Lion Green Public Toilets - People Counters, maintenance and opening hours.

We have installed battery powered people counters in all three toilets at Lion Green. The average weekly count over the 5 weeks they have been installed is 1,130 uses across all three toilets. (this also includes 2 visits per day by the cleaners). This clearly shows that the toilets were needed and are, contrary to some comments on social media, being well used.

The toilets will be closed at the beginning of next week (8th July) to allow for some essential maintenance work to the pipework, signage will be put up to alert users.

There has been a suggestion that the toilets could stay open past the current 6pm closing time, to allow for people using the green during the Summer and this is currently under consideration.

Lion Green to Weysprings - New Handrails for Steps.

The posts that support the handrail had all rotted through and some had broken off altogether, so in the interest of safety all the posts were renewed

We were able to retrieve and re-use the metal handrail which saved some money, but the work was funded from section 106 money from Waverley Borough Council

Churt Road wildflower verge project:

The Town council is supporting Haslemere Climate and Biodiversity Collective in the creation of a 750m-long wildflower verge on Churt Road, an initiative designed to reverse insect decline. Other partners include the National Trust, Buglife Uk and the Haslemere Biodiversity Group. The central portion of the verge will be left uncut until mid-summer with the verge edges being cut regularly by our contractors to allow local residents to walk along the pathways on either side. The grass will be cut and removed to reduce nutrient levels in mid-summer, followed by harrowing and seeding of a native meadow flower mix in September. A recent biodiversity audit of the site, conducted by aLyne Ecology Ltd, will provide a baseline for monitoring changes in number and diversity of species present.

On the 6th June an event took place on St Christopher's Green, Haslemere to commemorate the 80th Anniversary of D-Day.
