#### Upgrade to office IT systems

Over the Christmas break the data previously held on a town hall PC was migrated to Google Drive. The dual benefits of this being security and business resilience / ease of access as all council documents can now be access via a browser from any location (assuming the person trying to access them has permission!). As part of this exercise, we have replaced an obsolete computer with a new laptop so that all town hall devices can be upgraded to Windows 11.
